**Sunday:** High Mass with Asperges, followed by Vespers. **Closing hymn: 708 Salve Regina.** Please join in.

**Friday:** Choir practice after the 9:30 a.m. Mass. Latin Class at Father's residence, 6:30-8:00 p.m.

**Next Sunday:** New schedule in effect. **Holy Hour at 3:00 p.m.** with Confessions available **followed by Low Mass.** Confessions afterwards as needed. **We will not be doing Vespers** together that day. Please have the kindness not to interrupt the Benediction at the closing of the Holy Hour. Please come early enough for it, or wait until it is finished. *Please do not enter or leave the nave of the church during Benediction.*

**Collection** for Sunday, July 18, came to 836.00 + 100 for the 2nd collection. Thank you for your generosity!

**Regina Pacis Registration Forms** have recently been revised. Please note that you will need to register with Regina Pacis if you wish to request **Baptism, Confirmation, First Communion, or Matrimony.**

**Confessions** are heard before all Latin Masses at St. Peter's. Sundays 3:10 to 3:50 p.m., weekdays 6:30 to 6:50 a.m., and Fridays also 9:00 to 9:20 a.m. Please kindly allow Fr. Rickert the 10 min. he needs to prepare for Mass. Please feel free to request this sacrament at other times if this schedule doesn't work for you.

**St. Peter's Church** apologizes for any inconvenience in parking last Sunday. The construction work was not supposed to get in the way, and they apologize if it did.

**Important note about Sunday schedule.** Beginning on **August 1**, the schedule for **First Sundays** will be as follows. **Holy Hour** beginning at **3:00 p.m.** with Exposition and Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament. At the beginning of the exposition will be the Litany to the Sacred Heart and Consecration to the Sacred Heart as usual. There may be some additional prayers. **Father will then hear Confessions until 3:50.** The Holy Hour will conclude with Benediction. **Low Mass** will follow immediately. **Confessions afterwards** as needed.

**The sick and home-bound:** Please let Father know whenever any member of the Regina pacis Community is in the hospital or is confined to home because of illness or other physical conditions. He will be happy to bring them the Sacraments of Confession, Holy Communion and Anointing if they so desire.

**Blessings:** Please let Father know if you need to get a First Blessing or get something blessed. It's a very good idea to keep **exorcized salt** and **holy water** in supply at your home.

**Envelopes:** Just a helpful tip: If you are donating by check, it's not necessary to fill out the envelope with your name and address. Please do fill out the envelope if you are donating cash so that your donation can be properly acknowledged for tax purposes. Thank you!

***Quam Dilecta Tabernacula Tua* gives guidelines** to be observed in church. Please take a copy, read it, and keep it. If you are a parent, it may be worth going over these matters again with your children. We should all try to observe these guidelines without delay. If you have questions, please speak with Father.

**Bishop's Lecture Series:** Bishop Ronald Gainer will conclude this year's series on August 3, 2010, with a look at the relationship between the moral law, grace, and the authority of the Church. This lecture will place more emphasis on application. The lecture will be held in Hehman Hall at Christ the King Cathedral in Lexington. A Social from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m. precedes the lecture, which runs from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m. A question and answer period is included. This is a free event open to the public. Those who attended Bishop Gainer's presentation in May will agree that our Bishop is an excellent presenter or teacher of the truths of our Catholic Faith.

**Reading recommendation: The Roman Catholic Church: An Illustrated History** by Edward Norman. A very fine cultural history of the Church which also addresses certain historical misconceptions, e.g., in regard to the Crusades and the Inquisition. The illustrations chosen are generally superb.
